- What happened at this event?
- What is the significance of the event (why is it important to the history of the United States?)
- Events leading up to the event/aftermath

### **For an invention/new technology:**

- Who created/developed the technology?
- Important dates in the creation of the technology?
- Where was this innovation used?
- How did the invention work?
- What is the significance of the invention/technology (why is it important to the history of the United States?)
- Events leading up to the invention/technology
